What is Council doing / What is Council's Role?

- Council is continuing to work with the emergency service agencies to prepare long-term Recovery Plans for the region.
- Council Officers have been working directly with impacted residents in relation to the support that can be made available to assist with cleaning up and removal of waste and have connected individuals with the appropriate support services.
- Council is strongly recommending to all community groups and associations within fire
 affected communities to apply for a Community Development Grant. This round of
 Community Development Grants close on 10 May 2019.

Rebuilding

- Residents considering rebuilding should seek advice from a private building surveyor.
- State and Local Planning and Building Regulations will apply to residents wanting to rebuild.

Community Support

- Case support workers are available to work with individuals by helping them navigate the various support services available including:
 - o Financial assistance;
 - Mental health services;
 - o Family violence supports;
 - Services for repairing and rebuilding damaged properties and reestablishing livelihoods.
- The program is available now and for the next 12 months.

- A State Government Clean-Up program has been announced to support all the residents who were impacted by the devastating bushfires.
- Uninsured property owners
 - Property owners who wish to register interest in participating in the clean-up program are able to call 1300 199 048 Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm and register their details.
- Insured property owners
 - Impacted property owners with insurance will already have been working with their insurers to identify clean-up needs and engage contractors. If you have not already been in contact with your insurance provider, you should do so now.

Asbestos risk

- Asbestos material has been found on some properties. Residents need to be aware of the risks of asbestos.
- Residents must ensure that a suitably qualified and licensed person undertakes the clean-up, removal and disposal of asbestos.

Treated timber ash

- Ash from burnt timbers that have been treated with copper chrome arsenate (CCA)
 is a danger to people and animals.
- Keep children and pets away from the CCA-treated timber ash until it is removed.
- o Ash from CCA-treated timber can be double-bagged, sealed and taken directly to your local landfill. When removing CCA treated timber ash, wear protective gloves, disposable overalls, and a P1 or P2 face mask (P2 masks are sometimes referred to as N95 masks) to minimise exposure to dust. Do not bury CCA treated timber ash.
