## Booked Hard Waste Collection Service.

### Booking confirmation

# Instructions

Thank you for booking your hard waste collection. Please follow the instructions below to ensure that you are putting out hard waste correctly.

**1** Only put out items included on the 'yes' list.



**2** Place items in a neat pile on your nature strip on the weekend immediately before the collection week. Items must not be placed out any earlier than seven days before your scheduled collection week. Please note, your hard waste cannot be more than two cubic metres and each item should be easily lifted by two people. Materials over two cubic metres will not be collected. Please note, carpet must be rolled and tied (a maximum of three rolls that must be able to be lifted by one person).

**3** Place the orange 'BOOKED' sticker on the hard waste pile so that it can be seen clearly from the road. If you've misplaced your sticker please call 1800 969 278 to request another one.



If all of your items are removed by scavengers by the Sunday evening before your collection, please call the contractor on **1800 969 278** and cancel the booking to avoid losing your collection.

Car tyres (maximum four)  
No 4WD, SUV or Truck tyres



Electronic equipment such as TVs and DVDs



Car batteries



Motor oil and engine blocks



Glass and china (securely wrapped and labelled 'glass' or 'china')



Branches and prunings (tied and separated from other materials) less than 1.5 metres in length



General garden waste (other than branches/prunings), soil or earth



Household waste and recyclables



Timber (no longer than 1.5 metres and no more than 10 pieces)



Washing machines, stoves and fridges with doors removed



Building and renovation materials including cement sheeting or fences



Asbestos and other hazardous waste



Scrap metal, car parts and lawn mowers



Mattresses and bed bases (maximum of two)



Gas cylinders



Dangerous goods including household chemicals and pesticides



Paint tins (empty with lids removed)



Furniture and household appliances (includes carpet, no more than three rolls that can be lifted by one person)

Your items will be collected by up to three collection vehicles to maximise recovery. All material collected (including compacted material) is taken to a materials recovery facility at Knox Transfer Station for storing and recycling.
