- Community Development Grants;
- Sponsorship;
- Education Scholarships;
- Australia Day Event Funding;
- Rural Tree Grants;
- Worm Farm and Compost Bin Reimbursements;
- Recreation and Public Hall Maintenance Allocations; and
- Town and Rural Community Group Administration Allocations.
