GENERAL RUBBISH (weekly)



Use this bin only for items that can't be reused or recycled.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Broken glassware, crockery and mirrors
- ✓ Nappies, wet wipes, kitty litter, animal droppings
- ✓ Food and vegetable scraps, meat, dairy, seafood & egg shells
- ✓ Plastic lids and corks, pumps, sprays, droppers

- ✗ Green organics
- ✗ Household chemicals
- ✗ Building materials

MIXED RECYCLING (fortnightly)



All items must be **loose** and lightly rinsed.

- ✓ Accepted plastic bottles & containers
- ✓ Aluminium and steel tins, cans, foil, metal lids
- ✓ Cardboard, cereal boxes, egg cartons
- ✓ Paper, newspapers, magazines, paper envelopes

GARDEN ORGANICS (fortnightly)



Garden clippings only. Put your garden waste into the bin loose, not in bags.

- ✓ Leaves
- ✓ Twigs
- ✓ Plants
- ✓ Grass clippings, weeds

GLASS RECYCLING (every four weeks)



Put lightly rinsed, empty glass bottles and jars into the bin loose, not in bags. Please remove all lids.

- ✓ Glass jars including pasta sauce and condiment jars
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars for medicine or toiletries

LITTERING AND ILLEGAL DUMPING

Illegal dumping of waste or littering can cause significant environmental issues including contaminating land, polluting waterways, increasing the risk of fire and causing harm to local wildlife and their habitats. Cleaning up dumped litter and prosecuting offenders costs the community tens of thousands of dollars each year.

Offenders can be issued with significant fines and/or imprisonment, if prosecuted, under the Environment Protection Act 2017.

If you witness someone dumping waste or littering, or have come across dumped waste, please report it to Council on 1300 229 229 or the EPA Hotline on 1300 372 842.

What to put in my bins.

HOME COMPOSTING & WORM FARM REBATE

Composting is a great way to recycle naturally and helps reduce waste going to landfill. Council offers a compost bin and worm farm rebate to rate payers (conditions apply). Application forms are on Council's website.

TEXTILE RECYCLING

Council provides textile recycling at selected transfer stations in Baw Baw Shire. Residents have the option to recycle acceptable unwanted textile items such as clothing, shoes, belts, hats, underwear, linen, and towels by placing them in the free textile recovery bins at Lardner and Trafalgar transfer stations during opening hours. 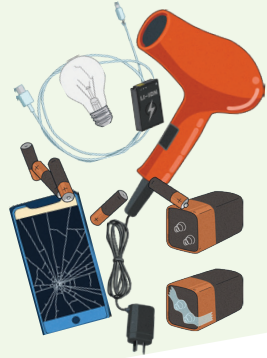
E-WASTE & X-RAYS

E-waste and old X-rays contain valuable resources and **must not** be placed in any kerbside bin.

E-waste refers to any unwanted electronic item with a plug, battery or cord including computers and office equipment, mobile phones, TV's, microwaves, power tools and light bulbs.

You can dispose of e-waste free of charge at Council's transfer stations and small e-waste items (such as batteries) and old x-rays can be disposed at our Drouin Customer Service Centre.

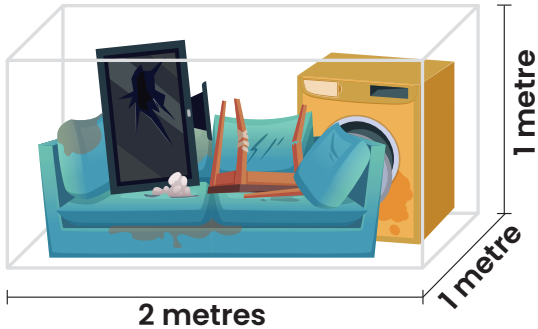
Remember: do not dispose of batteries in kerbside bins, as they can explode or cause fires.



HARD WASTE COLLECTION

What happens to my hard waste?

Hard waste is collected by our contractor WM Waste Management Services using a rear loading compactor truck and taken to Knox Transfer Station for sorting and recycling of suitable items.



If you think any of your hard waste can be reused, repurposed, or resold, please consider these options before making your booking.

Free 'at call' kerbside collection

Please call WM Waste Management Services on 1800 969 278 or visit www.hardrubbishmelbourne.com.au/baw-baw to book. Extended phone waiting times may occur during peak periods, your patience is appreciated.

Residents can book one free annual 'at call' kerbside collection per financial year of up to 2 cubic metres of hard waste placed on your nature strip (conditions apply).

Free do it yourself transfer station drop off

Residents can exchange their free kerbside hard waste collection for a free 'do it yourself' transfer station drop off of up to 2 cubic metres of hard waste or garden organics. To book a free 'do it yourself' transfer station drop off please call WM Waste Management Services on 1800 969 278 who manage these bookings.

Paid additional hard waste collection service

Residents can also book an 'at call' paid hard waste collection once per financial year. Bookings can be made by calling Council's Customer Service Centre during business hours on 1300 229 229 (conditions apply). See Council's website for details and costs.

Hard waste collection services are available only to residential households who have a kerbside general rubbish collection service (includes homeowners and tenants). Commercial, industrial, and vacant land is excluded.

Container Deposit Scheme

Victoria's Container Deposit Scheme (CDS Vic) commenced on 1 November 2023, as part of the State Government's new reforms to the waste and recycling sector which provides benefits to the community, environment and economy.

Victorians receive a 10-cent refund for every eligible container returned.

You can drop off your plastic soft drink bottles, glass beer and soft drink bottles, small fruit juice and flavoured milk cartons, along with soft drinks and alcohol sold in cans (between 150ml and 3L) to your nearest collection point to receive your refund.

Wine and spirit bottles, milk containers, paperboard cartons (over 1L) and cordial bottles are not included.

Return-it is the Network Operator responsible for managing collection sites in Baw Baw. Sites include:

- 42 Weerong Road, Drouin
- 4/15 Phoenix Street, Warragul
- as well as smaller collection points in Warragul, Drouin, Trafalgar, Longwarry and Neerim South.

Food and Garden Organics (FOGO) Service coming soon!

Council is planning to introduce a Food and Garden Organics (FOGO) service next year.

When FOGO is introduced, food scraps and garden clippings can be placed in your green bin.

This helps make the most of your food scraps and garden clippings, so they can be recycled into things like mulch and compost.

It is also cheaper to compost these materials than it is to send them to landfill.

The Victorian Government requires Councils to provide households with access to a four-waste stream system (including a food and garden organics service) as part of the Recycling Victoria: a new economy policy.

Under these reforms, Council will also be **replacing old dark green bin lids with new standardized yellow mixed recycling bin lids, and light green garden organics bin lids** in late 2025.

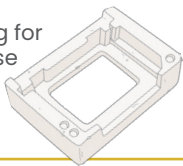


RIGHT IDEA, WRONG BIN. THE TOP ITEMS WE GET WRONG WHEN RECYCLING ARE:

Polystyrene

Polystyrene packaging (including food trays) should be placed in your general rubbish bin.

If this is too big for your bin, please dispose at a transfer station.



Soft Plastics

Soft plastics and plastic shopping bags should be placed in your general rubbish bin.

These items cannot be recycled in the mixed recycling bin.



Black Plastics

Black plastics including black coffee cup lids, black plant pots and seedling containers and black meat trays cannot be recycled and should be placed in the general rubbish bin.



PLEASE NOTE:

Bins are collected on scheduled days falling on all public holidays.

Bins need to be out by 2.00am for collection on Christmas Day.

If your bin has not been collected on a scheduled day, please contact Solo Resource Recovery on 5633 2009.

THE CORRECT WAY TO PLACE YOUR BINS FOR COLLECTION

- Place bins on the nature strip before 6am on collection day.
- Leave 50cm between bins and have the wheels facing your property.
- Keep bins clear of obstructions including trees, cars and light poles.
- The 240L (big) bin should be placed so that it can be emptied first (traffic approach side).
- The lid needs to be closed, and the bin should weigh no more than 75kg.
- Commercial bins in Central Business Districts (CBD's) must only be placed by the kerb between 4pm the day prior to collection and 10am on the day of collection.
