Title: Liza Pharaoh

### **PURPOSE**

For the Place Names Advisory Committee to consider naming the Western Park Netball Pavilion in honour of the late Liza Pharaoh.

### RECOMMENDATION

That the Place Names Advisory Committee:

 Consider the proposal to name the Western Park Netball Pavilion in honour of the late Liza Pharaoh.

#### **KEY INFORMATION**

A representative of the Warragul Industrials Football Netball Club first approached Council in January 2022 seeking advice on naming the new Western Park Netball Pavilion in honour of the late Liza Pharaoh. A respected netballer, Liza passed away in May 2021.

Liza has a long association with the Industrials and was granted Life Membership in 2008. With 382 netball games, she holds the record for the most games played with the 'Dusties'. At a club level, Liza won 12 Best and Fairest awards and six Best and Fairest Runners Up.

In 2018 the Netball Club created the Liza Pharaoh Perpetual Trophy for A Grade in her honour. The inscription reads:

"We are who we are because of your friendship, we are who we are because of your years of dedication, we fight the way we fight because of your courage."

The attached eulogy from friend and teammate Kate Farrell attest to Liza's reputation at the club, where she was considered a dedicated leader committed to the game and the club's culture.

In 2018 more than 50 people formed the team 'Pharaoh's Secret Angels' to participate in a walk, run and ride charity event to raise funds for the Peter

MacCallum Cancer Centre.



Under the Naming Rules for Place in Victoria Principle I - Using commemorative names, due consideration must be given to the person's regard within the community. Naming authorities should consider:

- The person's achievements;
- Relevant history and association to the area; and
- The significance of the family/person to the area/land.

A naming authority must have consent from family members of the person being commemorated. Commemorative names of a deceased person should be applied no less than two years posthumously, but exemptions can be sought.
